School Plan/Budget Update

For the Majority of the meeting, the council split into 4 groups to discuss:

- 1- District Strategic Plan – has recently been updated by the Davis School District
- 2- Windridge School Improvement Plan goals
- 3- State Board of Education Report Card
- 4- Superintendency Message – Personalized learning prepares students for future - from Superintendent Reid Newey

Each group spent 7-8 min discussing each item, then together, the council spent a few minutes to share the “big takeaways” from the group discussions. The “big takeaways” were:

- Behavior Management – there may be some need for social/emotional curriculum – respect for teachers seems to be dropping. Parents respect for teachers is important too.
- Skill building ideas for parents – there is a need to teach parents specific skill building ideas that they can do at home to help their children progress. i.e. reading strategies
- School Improvement Plan Goal #4 – Keyboarding – maybe keyboarding instruction should be happening in 2nd grade since at the end of 3rd grade, students need to type a 3 paragraph essay.
- Teaching digital literacy stuff could be useful – Microsoft Office products, how to use mouse, etc.
- The council has concerns about how many students are reading at home - should teachers incentivize reading more?

These topics will be discussed in greater detail at the next meeting.
